Discussion 3. Under what kinds of circumstances do you think we, as Christians, are likely to make choices or live as if God does not exist? What kinds of spiritual disciplines have you found helpful so that you do not "regress" this way?

Discussion 4. How would you explain to a 6-year-old that, when the Bible says, "Be Holy" it is NOT about our works or our efforts, but about our faith? How would you teach this?
