God's grand plans for this world always include details for implementation by His people. We are not responsible for the plan, nor for the outcome. We are responsible merely for our own
Discussion 1. When God moves in this world, He usually does it through people. Why is that an important concept for Christ followers to learn and remember?
Though it would not become apparent until many centuries later, God's plan to reconcile this broken world to Himself would include anyone and everyone who genuinely desired a with Him.
Discussion 2. Can you think of an example of having your mind radically changed about some spiritual truth, i.e., a spiritual belief of yours that was completely and thoroughly changed? Did it happen gradually or all at once? What (or who) did God use to change your mind?
